SERVICE	DESCRIPTION	TIME FRAME *
Weekly Lawn Cutting	<p>Grass will be cut on a weekly basis with a grass height of approximately 3" to 3.5" during the growing season. All clippings will be bagged and hauled away. Weekly line trimming around trees, landscape beds, and light poles will be completed along with weekly edging of all parking areas and walk ways.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Blades sharpened daily - Mowing patterns changed frequently - No cutting when it is raining heavily. If the property has wet areas or standing water, crews will go around the areas to avoid turf damage. - Crews are not responsible for moving personal property (i.e., trampoline) <p>CCL crews will not cut grass with pet waste present as it is not only a bio hazard and creates an unsafe, slippery condition for our crews but it is also unfair to other customers as our equipment will be full of pet waste.</p>	April through End of November
Spring Clean-Up	During the Spring and Fall months, there is a definite need to prepare the lawn and landscape beds for the upcoming season.	March – April
End of Season Clean- Up	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Spring bed clean-up will be performed in late March or April and includes debris removal, cutting down of Ornamental Grasses, trimming of Rose bushes, and cutting down any perennials that benefit from being cut down. Landscape bed edging is not included but can be added upon request. - Fall bed clean-up will be performed in late October to November and includes debris removal, cutting down of ornamental grasses and perennials that benefit from being cut down, and removal of fallen leaves. Ornamental grasses can be left untouched if requested. 	November
Spring Pre-Emergent (Plant Beds)	Pre-emergent is an herbicide that prevent weeds from growing. Pre-emergent needs to be applied before weeds like crabgrass, spurge, and clover emerge in the spring, otherwise the pre-emergent will not be as effective and weeds may still grow. This service is to aid in weed control and does not guarantee a weed free landscape bed.	March – April
Spring Aeration	Core aeration can be performed to improve air flow in the soil. Aerating breaks up the compacted soil, and the holes they leave behind encourage healthy root growth and improve access to water and nutrients for the grass. This is a service that Camphouse Country Landscaping highly recommends.	March – April
Fall Aeration		August – October

Spring Seeding	Overseeding can be performed to improve the lawns overall health and appearance. Simply explained, lawn overseeding is a process of spreading grass seed over the already existing turf. Please note that if the property is fertilized, spring seeding will take place 6-8 weeks after first application is applied.**	March – June
Fall Seeding		September – October
Phase 1 Trimming	Trimming of ornamental trees (i.e., Lilac trees, Redbud, Hydrangea trees) and shrubs can be performed twice a year. However, each shrub/ornamental tree has its own ideal season and method of pruning (i.e., a shrub that is flowering will not be trimmed). Not every shrub can be pruned or trimmed the same way.	May – July
Phase 2 Trimming	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Allows your plant to grow healthy and retain its natural shape. - Promotes fresh growth, more flowers, and an overall stronger shrub. - Not trimming your shrubs can result in the interior branches of your plant to not get adequate sunlight or nutrients. Essentially, the shrub becomes too big to support itself, so it begins to decay or thin out. <p>Phase 1 and 2 trimming does not include shade trees (i.e., Maple, Oak, Birch, Linden) but they can be trimmed upon request. Camphouse Country Landscaping does not trim anything taller than 15 feet.</p>	September - November
Fertilizer / Weed Control	<p>Our fertilizer and weed control program, consists of six (6) applications throughout the year, allowing us to eliminate weed problems as they occur and to keep your lawn nutrient-rich at all times.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Increases root systems and promotes new grass growth - Helps grass recover from sustained traffic and harmful pest damage - Replaces nutrients lost from drought and mowing <p>Applications take place every 5-6 weeks depending on weather. The timing may change if there is significant rain, a drought, and/or high temperatures. Two services may be completed at the same time (weed control and fertilizer). The fertilizer is a dry, granular mix and the weed killer is a liquid mix. Our machines are set up to perform both services/applications at the same time.</p>	<p>6 Applications</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - One (1) Turf Builder with Crab Grass Preventative - Three (3) Turf Builder - Two (2) Liquid Weed Control
Spring Grub Treatment (Preventative Treatment)	Grubs are one of the most damaging types of lawn pests. Grubs are the immature form (aka larvae) of scarab beetles. These beetles often lay their eggs in lawns, burying eggs beneath the soil surface. When those eggs hatch, hungry grubs come out and start to feed on your lawn's roots.	May – June
Fall Grub Treatment (Active Treatment)		September – October

* Services will be performed during the growing season, approximately April 1st through the end of November. In the event of inclement weather that prevents services from being rendered (i.e., rain, snow, extreme temperatures), the services will be rescheduled for a different day during that same week (earlier or later), which may include Saturday. Camphouse Country Landscape, LLC holds all scheduling rights, as our business production is solely based on weather, which can be unpredictable.

** Please notify us if you have a different company fertilizing your property so we can properly schedule the spring seeding. If the grass seed is installed too soon after the fertilizer application, the grass seed will not germinate due to the pre-emergent in the fertilizer.
